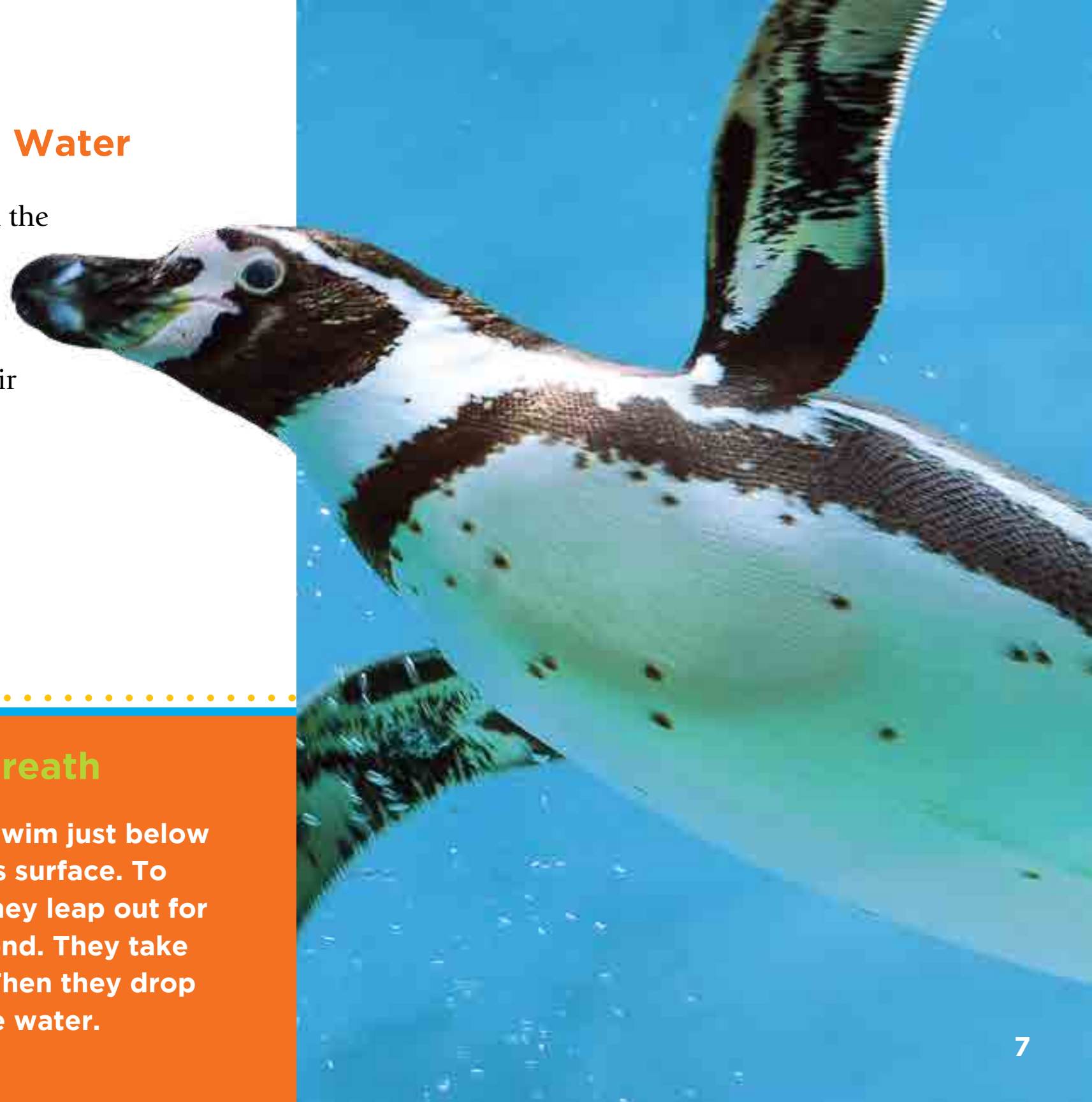
# A Day in the **Life**
