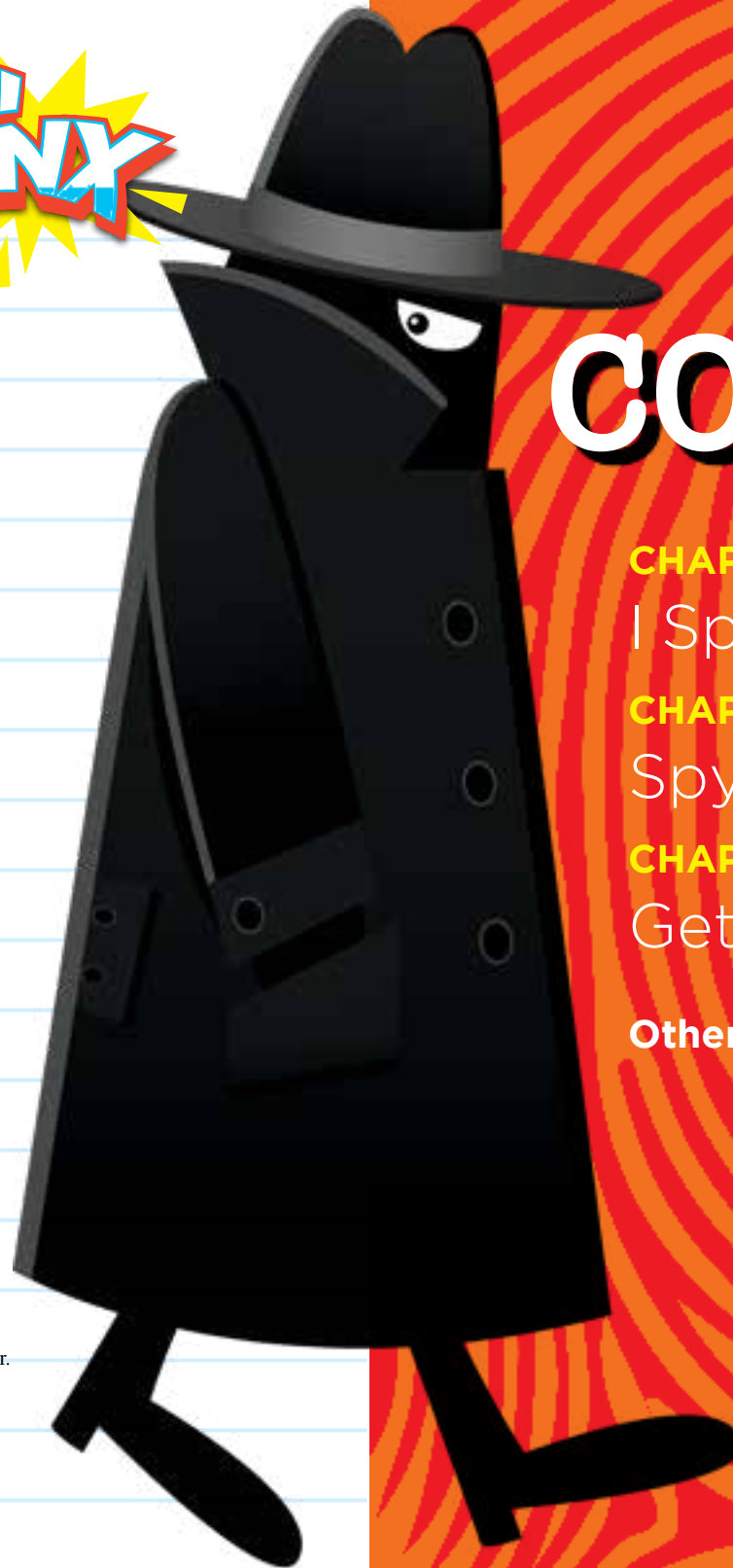

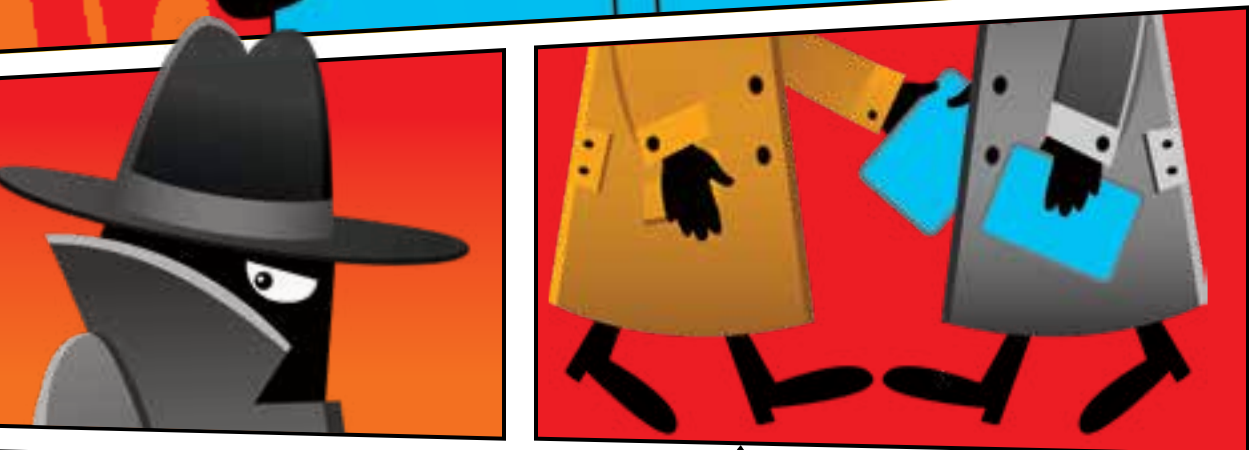

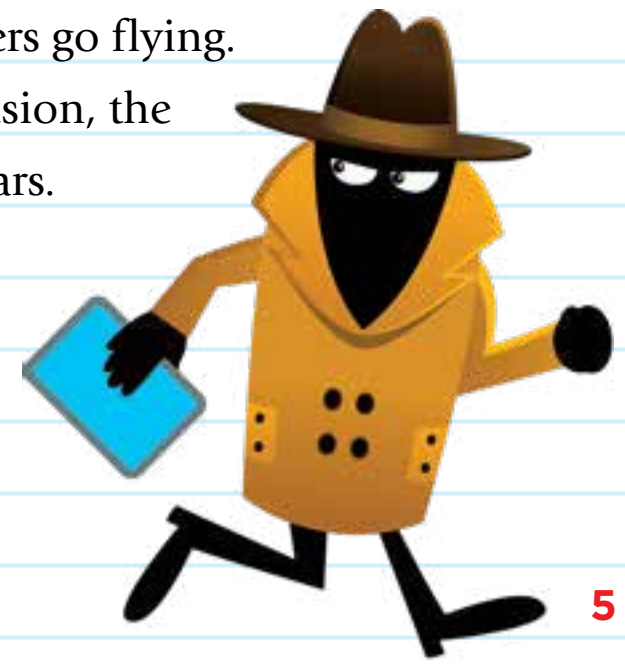

See It All
