# A Day in the **Life**

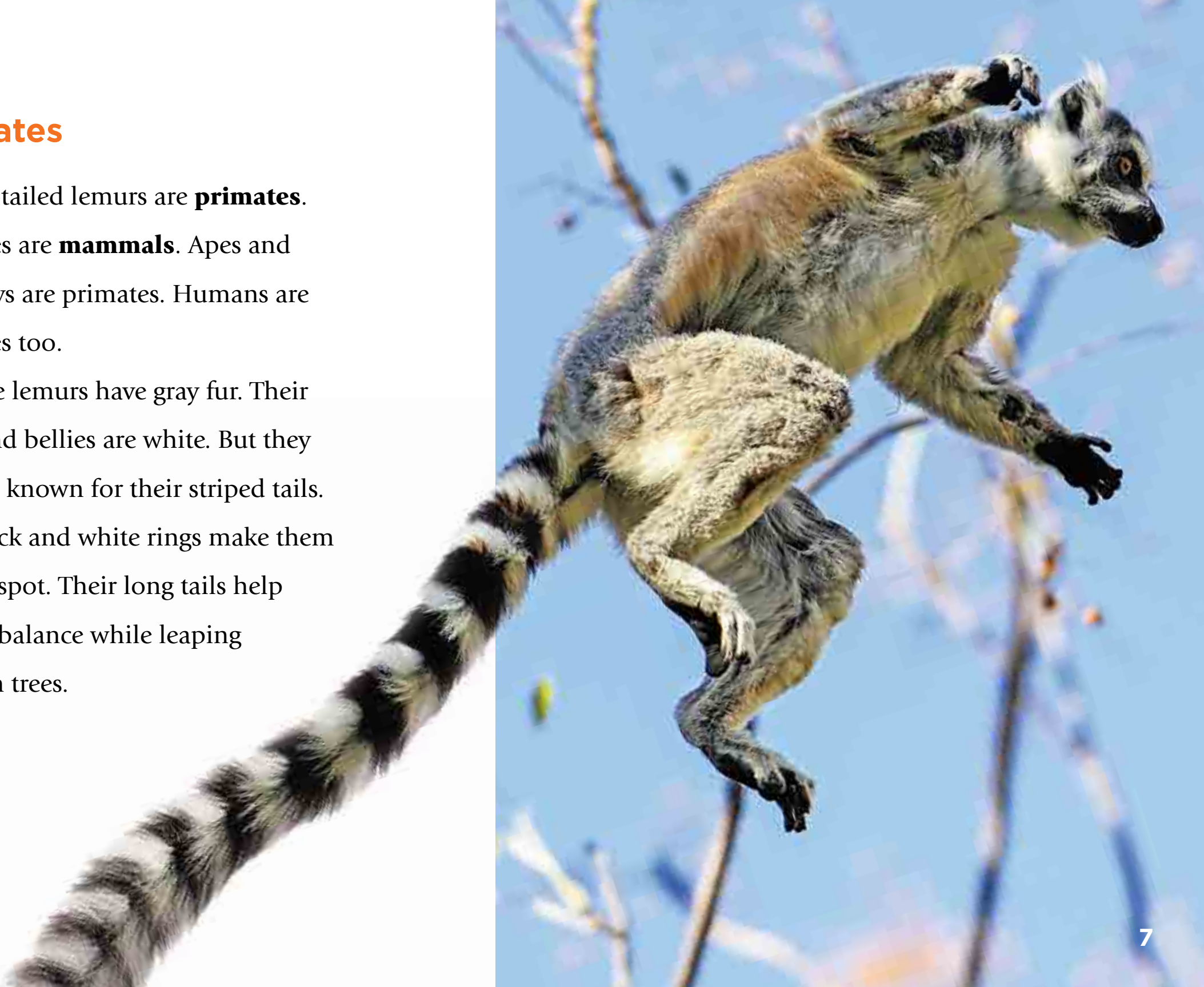
It's morning. A **troop** of ring-tailed lemurs wakes up in a tree. The lemurs eat the tree's fruit. As they eat, they call to one another.

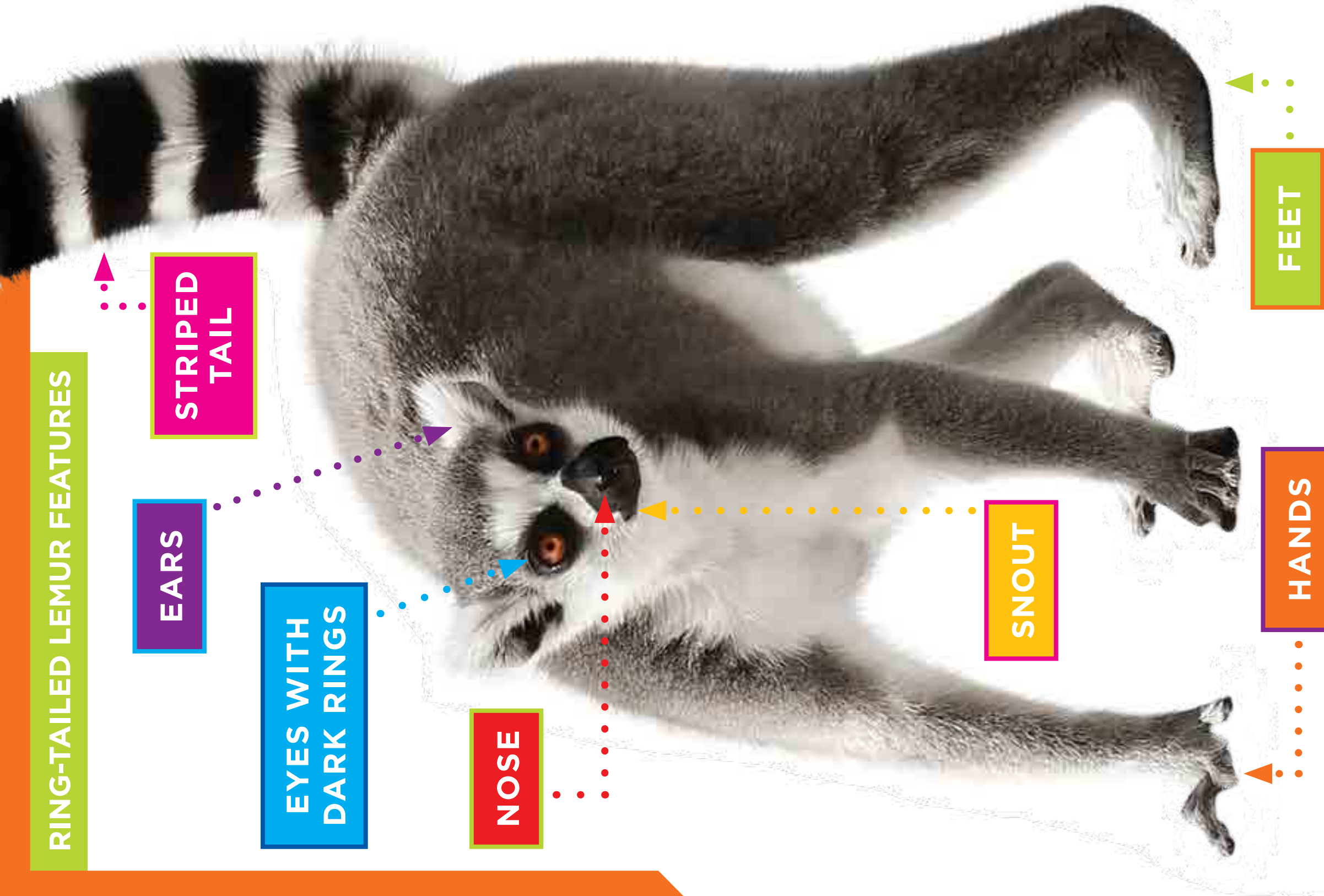
## Primates
